Workshop on Audit for ASEAN Countries: Key Takeaways from China

The Workshop on Audit for ASEAN Countries, led by the China National Audit Office (CNAO), showcased advanced audit practices. The workshop held from October 21-30, 2024, in China. The workshop was attended by 29 delegates from 9 member SAIs of ASEANSAI, with the support from CNAO. Participants explored China's auditing innovations through presentations, industrial visits in Nanjing and Xi'an, and a visit to the Shan'xi Provincial Audit Office. The event strengthened networks between SAI from ASEAN countries and Chinese Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs).

Key insights from the workshop included CNAO's research-based audits, spanning 3-6 months for comprehensive reviews, and its subject-based audit divisions specializing in natural resources and social security. CNAO's 30 out-posted offices enhance oversight, while local audit institutions operate independently but report hierarchically to CNAO. Tenure-based audits to assess public officials and CNAO's unique National Audit Standard were notable practices that could inspire improvements in other SAIs.

SAI Thailand's Role in Climate Adaptation: Addressing Challenges Through Performance Audits (2022-2024)

From 2022 to 2024, the State Audit Office of the Mangrove restoration efforts tackled issues Kingdom of Thailand (SAI Thailand) conducted like unsuitable planting groundbreaking environmental performance overlapping land claims, prompting GISaudits to address the nation's pressing climate based adaptation challenges. Thailand faces severe collaboration among stakeholders. These risks from climate change, including floods, reforms droughts, coastal erosion, and air pollution, protection and carbon which threaten ecosystems, livelihoods, and advancing SDG 13 (Climate Action) and SDG economic stability. Through these audits, SAI 14 (Life Below Water). Addressing air Thailand enhanced accountability, transparency, pollution caused by burnt sugarcane farming, and alignment with the Sustainable Development SAI Thailand recommended stricter Goals Systems (GIS), drones, and big data analytics, the reduced pollution and improved public audits provided precise evaluations while health. incorporating community participation to Urban sustainability audits revealed gaps in address local needs effectively.

SAI Thailand's audits covered critical projects In Nakhon Ratchasima, reforms in recycling such as wastewater management, mangrove and community engagement improved waste restoration, and air pollution mitigation. The segregation, contributing to SDG 11 audit of the Wastewater Management Project in (Sustainable Cities) and SDG 12 (Responsible Khon Kaen Municipality exposed inefficiencies in Consumption). By addressing systemic treatment infrastructure and environmental challenges and fostering innovation, SAI compliance, resulting in improved water quality Thailand has set a global benchmark for and alignment with SDG 6 (Clean Water and climate adaptation auditing, paving the way Sanitation).

sites monitoring and enhanced biodiversity strengthened sequestration, leveraging advanced penalties, mechanized harvesting incentives, Geographic Information and expanded biomass utilization, leading to

waste management and green city initiatives. for a sustainable and resilient future.

As part of the ASEANSAI Knowledge Sharing SAI Indonesia, SAI Malaysia, and SAI Thailand Work Plan 2024-2025, aligned with Strategic shared insights on topics like SDGs governance, Goal No. 2 of the ASEANSAI Strategic Plan forestry management, and an advanced 8Es 2022–2025, the Office of the Auditor General of framework for SDGs audits.
